Formulates and implements general safety/security policies and procedures to be followed by company personnel in compliance with local, state, and federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) rules and regulations. Analyzes loss control and accident reports, identifies trends, and implements processes to prevent recurrence. Consults with all departments on design and use of equipment, vehicles, fire prevention and safety/security programs. Inspects or tours organization facilities or the field to detect existing or potential accident and health hazards, and recommends corrective or preventative measures where indicated. Keeps managers, supervisors, and employees alerted to the hazards of working with toxic fumes, dangerous chemicals, and any other hazardous substances, conditions, or situations. Participates in the investigation of accidents and injuries and cooperates in the preparation of material and evidence for organization use in hearings, lawsuits, and insurance investigations. Ensures federal, state, and local regulations are followed for drivers of company vehicles. Administers drug/alcohol testing process for employees. Compiles and submits reports required by regulatory agencies, corporate and division offices. In conjunction with Benefits Administrator, oversees the administration of workers' compensation program including working with the insurance carrier to return employees to gainful employment, thereby, reducing lost work days. Interacts with the corporate office and division management to reduce costs related to insurance rates and litigation. Devises, coordinates, and presents training programs or media that will increase proficiency in safe practices and promote safety consciousness. Maintains accurate safety files and records in working with our insurance carriers to insure the company's interest is protected in handling claims and lawsuits. Conducts safety training, safety inspections, investigates accidents/incidents, and recommends preventative solutions. Works with contractors to ensure they are in compliance with all contractual requirements related to safety.

OTHER COMMENTS: While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to walk, talk, or hear. The employee frequently is required to stand. The employee is occasionally required to sit, use hands to handle, or feel objects, tools, or controls, reach with hands and arms, climb or balance, stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl. The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 40 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close, distance, and color vision. INFO ON SAFETY JOB IN THE SAN ANTONIO AREA



Consultant Work

The following is brief summary of the work:

- This contract work and not work as an employee.
- The individual must be self starting. In most cases there is no firm schedule but the work does need to be completed within a reasonable time.
- The individual should have experience in construction, manufacturing, and various other fields.
- The individual is expected to conduct initial comprehensive audits with periodic safety & health inspections. As needed employee training would also be anticipated. You identify the specific safety and health needs; then provide those services.
- The individual must be able to prepare reports, take photos, answer client questions & concerns.

- Pay \$35 / hour for the 1st two weeks. We want to be sure you can prepare the needed reports. If reports are acceptable, pay rate would change to \$45 per hour. It would remain at that level until we were confident that you are able to meet the client needs. Generally if you perform well, within 3 months you should be at \$50 per hour. You are paid for travel time, plus mileage at \$0.445 / mile. You are also paid for the time required to prepare the report.
- The individual will be servicing about 25 companies and this number is expected to grow. Initially, your income should range from \$1000 to \$2500 per week.
